Campers under the age of 18 may not be left unsupervised before 4:00 pm Sunday, July 15th or after 12:00 noon on Saturday, July 21st, without prior arrangements with the Camp Directors. Dear Campers, Parents, and Guardians:

Thank you for considering Camp Stover in your summer plans this year. If you are new to Camp Stover, we have included a little more information in this letter for you, so please continue to read on. If you are familiar with how Camp Stover works, please feel free to skip down to the "Registration" portion of this letter and then continue on. There are some important items for you to know.

A little about Camp Stover... Camp Stover is a Church Camp, owned and operated by members of the Church of the Brethren in the District of Idaho. For more on the Church of the Brethren you may check the following web sites: www.mtndove.org, www.nampacob.org or www.idcob.org. Camp Stover is located right outside of New Meadows, Idaho.

Camp week at Camp Stover...July 15th -21st 2012 Camp Stover is an inter-generational Church Camp, with all ages coming together for one (1) week of camping. Some activities are inclusive of the entire camp, such as meals and the evening campfire and some activities are done by age groups.

Adults stay in reserved rooms, cabins, personal tents, trailers, or RV's; and children who have not completed the 4th grade must spend their nights with and be accompanied and supervised by their parent, guardian, or another pre-consulted adult. **To reserve a spot for your tent, trailer, or RV, or to reserve a room or cabin, call Gary Ackerman at (208) 467-2014 or 890-8572.** Accommodations during camp week are at no charge however there will be a \$25 cleaning deposit and an additional \$25 pet deposit, for those with pets that will be returned after cleaning at check out.

Kids who will turn 9 before Sept. 1st 2012 thru the summer of their 12th grade year stay in our "age group" cabins; as follows: Those who will turn 9 years old by Sept. 1st, 2012 stay in our "Junior" cabins, those who will turn 12 years old by Sept. 1st, 2012 stay in our "Jr. High" cabins, and those who turn 15 by Sept. 1st, 2012 stay in our "Youth" cabins. Each of these age groups consists of a boy's cabin, girl's cabin, a resource leader, counselor(s) for boys, and counselor(s) for girls. Age groups will go out of camp at least two (2) times during camp week, once to go to Zims Hot Springs to swim, and once on an all day hike.

Registration... Pre-registration must be post-marked this year by June 15th. The Pre-registration includes a free Camp T-shirt. See the cover sheet to this packet, which includes pricing and remittance address.

If you are registering a child, please make sure you have the following:

- Completed and signed registration and consent form, (Page 1 of the Kids Packet).
- Kid's who have will turn 9 years old by Sept. 1st 2012 – 12th grade also need a completed "Information and Medical History Packet" (pages 2-4 of the Kids Packet).

All Campers must register.

Dress Code... Please note the dress code on page 1 of the Adult Packet and Page 2 of the Kids Packet.

During Camp Week... Camp officially starts with the evening meal on Sunday, July 15th, however the counselors will be ready to greet the age group campers and help them settle in at 4:00 p.m. Age group campers will be with their age groups at all times and must check with their counselor(s) or resource leader before leaving their area. Camp Week is officially over at noon on July 21st.

If you need to contact your camper at Camp, call Keith Goering @ 941-3613 or Linda Goering @ 899-3167. Your camper will not have free access to their cell phone at camp. Kids seem to not be able to stop texting and miss out on bonding with their group. Cell phone use will be at the discretion of the resource leader.
