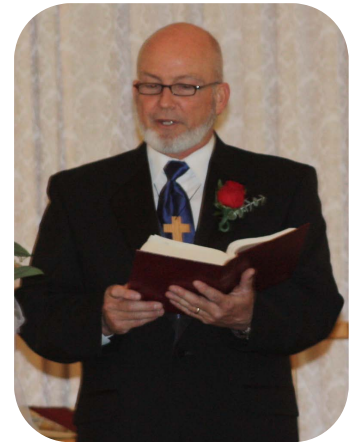

The theme, "I Believe," was lived out in various aspects of worship, business and fellowship. Led by Moderator Don Morrison, conference delegates affirmed the following business items:

- \* As a result of discussion with and a proposal received from Colin Douglas, the Idaho district will move forward with further discussion regarding support of a new church plant in Missoula, Montana.
- \* The conference voted to approve an invitation from the Mt. View Church that the Idaho district support recognition of Bethel Ministries as an official ministry of the Mountain View Church of the Brethren.
- \* It was decided to continue our 10-year financial commitment to Sudan and that the funds be held in the district Sudan fund until God opens an opportunity for us to use those funds in ministry to the Sudanese.

- On November 14 we held a Harvest Appreciation Service and Dinner. With 75 friends, neighbors, and family members attending, it was obvious that God has placed many special people in our lives.
- Our congregation is moving ahead with plans for phase one of our building project. We covet your prayers and support as we proceed to develop our plans, apply for permits, and begin site work.

### Bowmont:

- Fall has been a busy but blessed time at Bowmont. We celebrated Caleb and Rosa (Goering) Scott's wedding on September 12<sup>th</sup>. We also had our annual "Sunday School Kick-off" and re-started our Children's Church. We are now up to 14 kids in Children's Church!
- In October we started our weekly Christmas play rehearsals and held our 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Harvest Carnival on October 30<sup>th</sup>. We had 92 elementary kids as well as their families! What a great time of food, fellowship, & fun! Also in October we honored Wes & Bonnie Waggoner during pastor appreciation Sunday and their 20 years at Bowmont!
- We held a "Family Game Night" on Friday November 12<sup>th</sup>. Our "Craft and Baked Good Sale" was held on November 20<sup>th</sup>. This fundraiser will go toward our "Community Center and Fellowship Hall Building Fund". November 21<sup>st</sup> was our Annual Harvest Dinner.
- With hanging of the greens, caroling, outreaches, and the Christmas program in the morning and evening on December 19<sup>th</sup>, December is already fast approaching...

### Community Twin Falls:

- We have been blessed with the addition of families and have been able to start a youth Sunday School in addition to our adult Sunday School. We also have a young adult class that is meeting on Thursday nights and the Bible Study and dinner is still going strong on Tuesday evenings. - During Advent we will explore how our **Extraordinary God**, worked through **Ordinary People**, to bring about the greatest miracle ever. ### WORK TRIP TO SUDAN

Athanasus Ungang (known to many of us in the COB Idaho district) is heading up a work camp to Sudan. His anticipated departure date is Jan 8, 2011. Vaccinations are required (check with Center for Disease Control for specifics), airline tickets are about \$1700, and about \$1000 (for two weeks) will be needed for lodging and meals. The stay can be from 2-4 weeks. Two passport-type pictures will also be needed to secure a visa from Nairobi, Kenya into Sudan. Contact Pastor Bill Miller (871-7730) if interested.
