- The Church Board has signed a contract with King Construction to design, get permits, and begin work by April. The first leg of getting the infrastructure (well, sewer, drainage, parking areas etc.) done. The second push will be for the building. We launched a building fund campaign for pledges, donations, and reach out to our members and friends for support. Drawings of our plans will be forth-coming...or so the architect tells us.

Report from Idaho Brethren Disaster Ministries

Volunteer to Chalmette, LA ~ January 2-9, 2011

This year's contingent travelling from the Idaho district was small compared to some years. Most of us travelled New Year's Eve in order to get cheaper air rates. Our group consisted of Ed Kerschenstiener and his grandchildren, Natasha, Kayla and David; Deanna Carr, Bruce Peterson, Michele and Tim Hughes, Orian Odendhal, and myself, Denise Sanchez. With the exception of Orian, this was not our first trip to the Chalmette project, but it will be our last. Brethren Disaster Ministries will be shutting down it's project there by July. Reconstruction in that devastated community seemed painfully slow to those waiting and praying for help, but those of us returning each year after Katrina have seen amazing progress. Mary Mueller, a project director in Chalmette, commented that this last year she has seen Chalmette come to life just with the opening of big stores like Walmart and Home Depot. A new hospital is soon to open.

The homes we worked on this year were homes of people who had paid fly-by-night constructions companies for repairs that weren't done properly or at all. Some of us got to see a lady move into her home after it had been rebuilt by BDM, The nuns, and St. Bernard Project, cooperatively. We could hear her, her sister and daughter shouting and praising the Lord as they went from room to room in her new house. Soon neighbors from across the street and driving by were shouting and welcoming her return. That was the first time Deanna and I got to see a family get moved back home. We got tears and goosebumps.

The most amazing experience for many of us was working with Mary Mueller in the kitchen. Mary is a dynamo. She runs the volunteer house like a well oiled machine. She shops for vanloads of food at a time, cooks 2 meals a day for an average of 30 hungry people, does their dishes, keeps the house clean, organizes, does paperwork, leads and every Tuesday, cooks a taco dinner for the Brethren AND the St. Bernard Project and Americorp volunteers, who call her Mother Mary. She leaves at 7:00 P.M. to start again the next morning. You can compliment Mary on her feats, but her answer will always be, "God is good." We can better appreciate Dee Fillmore and Jenette Freeman, when as assistant directors, they take over the kitchen on their tours of duty.

We all come home from our volunteer experiences feeling multiply blessed. God is good!

Soul Preparation—A Journey to Conference

For over 250 years, Annual Conference has served a valuable role in the life of the Christian movement known as the Church of the Brethren. We have gathered to seek the mind of Christ on matters of common concern, mission, and service. Much of this history has been recorded in decisions that formed how Brethren lived out God's presence in their families, congregations, districts, and the world. However, that history extends beyond the minutes of business to the more prayerful manner in which Brethren entered into the gathering of Conference. In 2011, how will we enter prayerfully into our gathering in Grand Rapids?

I offer to you as members, leaders, congregations, and districts of our denomination the following guide to plan for your soul preparation in these six months leading to Annual Conference. May these help us all to listen to the Holy One and to each other as we seek to discern the mind and spirit of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

Reflect: Take time to reflect on the purpose and theme of Annual Conference and how AC contributes to your life, your congregation, and your district. Use silence to invite your reflection and to offer opportunity to listen to what God is saying.

Purpose of Annual Conference: To unite, strengthen, and equip the Church of the Brethren to follow Jesus.

Theme for 2011 Annual Conference: Gifted with Promise: Extending Jesus' Table.

Pray: Schedule opportunities for individual and corporate prayer. Join Annual Conference officers in their weekly prayer time at 8 am on Wednesday mornings or schedule another time for your Annual Conference prayers. Include Annual Conference in the prayers in congregational worship.

Highlights for Prayer: Conference Officers, Standing Committee, Delegates, Business items including the 2 Special Response items, Conference Director & Office personnel, many volunteers, Church of the Brethren national staff and district leadership.

Study: Engage in studies using the following:

Bible Passages of the Conference Theme: Matthew 14:13-21, Mark 6:30-44, Luke 9:10-17 and John 6:1-14 plus Mark 8:1-10 and Matthew 15:32-39

Bible Passages for the Worship Services: John 2:1-12; Luke 7:36-8:3; Luke 14:12-14; John 21:9-14

Bible Passages for the daily Bible Study sessions: Jeremiah 30-33, especially 31:31-34; Hebrews 6, 11, and 9:15; Acts 2:33 & 39

Business Items, including the studies provided in the Special Response Process

Acts 15 – the chapter often read for the beginning of Annual Conference

Serve: Assemble and bring a school kit to Annual Conference to be presented as part of the offering in Opening Worship on Saturday Evening and then given to Church World Service. You may bring these kits as individuals or families. Information on the contents of school kits may be found at

www.churchworldservice.org/site/PageServer?pagename=kits_school.

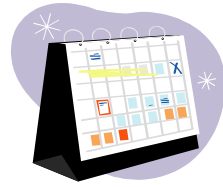
Witness: Share the story of Annual Conference with someone else as a way to "extend Jesus' table", even inviting those persons into the fellowship of the Church of the Brethren in your congregation.

I challenge us all to be creative in how we incorporate the above opportunities into our personal and congregational life. You may want to plan special gatherings for study, reflection, and prayer. I would particularly challenge pastors and church leaders to plan a focus on Annual Conference for Pentecost Sunday June 12. Pentecost served as the pivotal Sunday of Annual Conference in much of our history. Use the conference theme and scriptures, develop your own liturgy of prayers and hymns, include a personal witness to Annual Conference by someone in your congregation, and highlight the movement of the Holy Spirit as God's people gather for fellowship, worship, and discernment.
